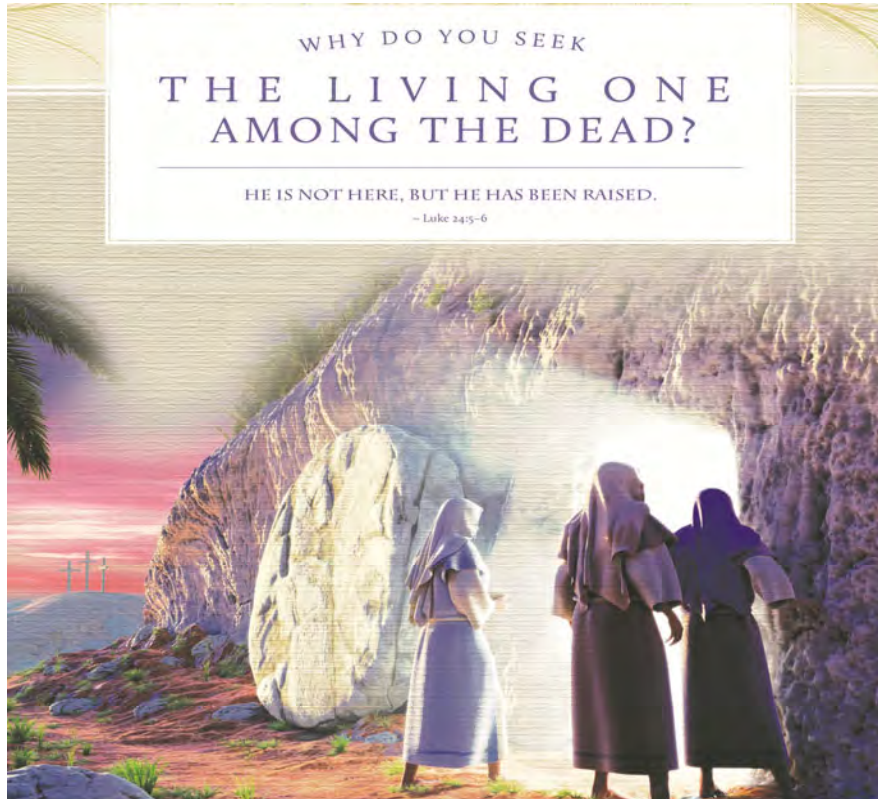

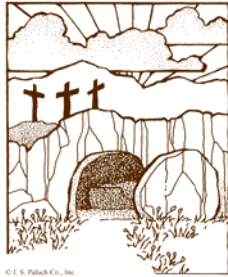

DRAWN INTO THE STORY

"We are witnesses!" The scripture readings for Easter Sunday concentrate on details reported by eyewitnesses. Listen carefully and you will be drawn into the stories yourself. Peter reports the good works Jesus did, his death on the cross, and his resurrection. The passage from John's Gospel has us running to the empty tomb with Peter and John and peering inside to see the cloths used to cover Jesus' body. Psalm 118 sums up our response: "It is wonderful in our eyes!"



What resurrection details do we see in our lives today? How have we died to our old lives and been raised up again with Jesus? Let us pay attention to the new life around us. It is wonderful in our eyes.

Dear Parishioners and friends,

Happy Easter!

Today we celebrate Christ's triumph over death! We began our celebration last night with the **Easter Vigil** , also called the **Paschal Vigil** or the **Great Vigil of Easter**, the first official celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. It is during this service that the water of the baptismal font is solemnly blessed and any catechumens and candidates for full communion are initiated into the church, by baptism and/or confirmation. After the celebration of the sacraments of initiation, the congregation renews their baptismal vows and receive the sprinkling of baptismal water.

“The rubrics of the *Missale Romanum* remind us that this ‘**mother of all vigils**’ is the ‘**greatest and most noble of all solemnities** and it is to be unique in every single Church’ (*Missale Romanum*, ‘Rubrics for the Easter Vigil’ (EV), no.2). On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life. Therefore, the Easter Vigil does not correspond to the usual Saturday evening Mass and its character is unique in the cycle of the liturgical year. The Vigil, by its very nature, "ought to take place at night" (EV, no. 3). It is not begun before nightfall and should end before daybreak on Easter Sunday. “ (USCCB, The Roman Missal and the Easter Vigil).

The Easter Vigil liturgy is the most beautiful liturgy in the Roman Catholic Church. It consists of four parts: Service of Light, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Baptism, and Liturgy of the Eucharist. All Catholics should try to attend this beautiful service.

The “**SALUBONG**” (in English means meeting or welcoming) is one of the traditions that has been well-preserved by the Filipinos. The Salubong is an Easter Sunday pre-dawn ritual or ceremony that reenacts the Risen Christ’s meeting with His mother. The tradition requires a child dressed as an angel (in the Philippines, the angel would be lowered by ropes from a high platform) to lift the mourning veil of the grieving Mother Mary (the statue of Mother Mary). The two images of the risen Christ and of the Mother Mary will come from different sides of the street. The participants in the procession are segregated by gender. The men and boys follow the image of Jesus Christ, while the women and girls follow the image of Mary. The two groups will meet in the churchyard and the procession of the images of Christ and His mother ends up inside the church with the two groups join together for the joyous Easter Mass celebration.

May you find hope, peace, and joy in the love of the Risen Christ!

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

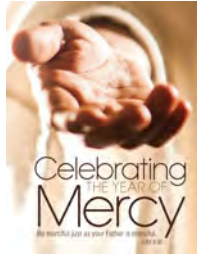
Easter Sunday

Jubilee Year of Mercy

Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. Alleluia! Easter is always, but especially in this Jubilee Year of Mercy, the victory of God's gentle but invincible mercy raising up Jesus, "faithful witness, the first-born of the dead" (Revelation 1:5), "first-born among many brothers [and sisters]" (Romans 8:29), conquering death in all its forms, in all of us in the human family. In Luke's Vigil Gospel, heavenly messengers send the women forth: "Remember what [Jesus] said to you" (Luke 24:6). In John's Gospel, the empty tomb likewise "sends forth" Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the Beloved Disciple, who believe though they do not fully understand. Finally, Luke's evening "Emmaus" Gospel sends us forth, as "missionaries of mercy," assuring us that we will encounter the Risen Lord, today and every day, in "the stranger" we meet along life's journey, in "the Word that makes our hearts burn within us," and "in the breaking of bread" (see Luke 24:32, 35).
