

Today's Gospel Reflection

1st Reading: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 * Psalm: Ps 67:2-3, 5-6, 8 *
 2nd Reading: Rv 21:10-14, 22-23 * Gospel: Jn 14:23-29

THE GIFT OF PEACE

We are offered another vision in today's second reading, a vision of the New Jerusalem, "coming down out of heaven from God" (Revelation 21:10). Read between the lines describing the radiant city, and we find that the greatest beauty revealed is the beauty of perfect symmetry and order, a city founded on the faith of the twelve tribes of Israel and the Twelve Apostles, lit only by the glory of God.



The first reading and the Gospel are linked to this idealized description of the New Jerusalem. In both we read of distress and disturbance countered by the gift of peace. "My peace I give to you," Jesus assures his disciples at the Last Supper (John 14:27). In keeping with that gift, the apostles and elders, in the reading from Acts, decide not to disturb the peace of new Gentile believers. The undue burden of circumcision will not be imposed on them.



Dear Parishioners and friends,

Are you a registered member of a Parish?

From time to time we write this reminder to explain the importance of being a registered parishioner. It is one of the precepts of the Church, that one has to support the Church, in particular his parish. It is our duty to be involved in the life of the Church—to continue the mission of our Lord Jesus through His Church, through the parish.

You may ask: *“I always go to church and attend Mass, participate in church activities and support its fundraising projects, why do I need to register?”*

There is no fees or annual dues when you register, but there are many benefits of being a registered member of a parish. If you are registered member it means that you are part of the parish community, that you belong to the parish family.

- When we go to Mass, most of the time (if not all the time), we give donations in the collection basket at the offertory. If you are not a registered member, your donation is not recorded. But, if you are a registered member and use the envelopes provided to you, your contributions are recorded and at the end of the year you may request a statement of contributions for Income Tax purposes.
- There may come a day when you will need good character references. A couple of weeks ago, someone requested a good character reference per request by the Supreme Court. He attends regularly our celebrations. However, upon checking our records, we could not find his name. He is not a registered member. Sad to say, we were not able to certify for him.
- When you are invited to be a sponsor of baptism or confirmation in another parish, you will be asked to provide certification from the parish where you belong. You may have been participating in the services of the church and giving contributions to the church, but if you are not registered, the parish will have no record of your participation/contribution, and will not be able to certify that you are an active and participating member of the parish.
- Some families came to our parish for sacraments because they are not registered members in the church where they regularly attend Mass and not able to schedule baptism, or even funeral.

If you are not yet a member of the parish, now - on the Jubilee Year of Mercy - is the time to register and be actively involved in the life of the Church, and of the parish in particular.

Thank you to all who have been involved in our Church and supporting Saint Michael Parish. We thank God for your generosity, goodness and kindness. May God continue to bless you and reward you a hundredfold for your generosity.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

One ancient Roman custom that was approved by the church was the veiling of the bride. When a single woman pledged her life to Christ, in a way of life not dissimilar to today’s religious women, the outward sign of this commitment was a veiling. In ancient Rome, a woman with uncovered head was unmarried, and a veiled woman was “off limits to suitors.” It was one small step to decide that a bride should receive a veil from the hands of the church as a sign of her new state in life. The prayer that accompanied the veiling was beautiful, and sung, a kind of consecratory prayer that was very similar to the prayer of ordination, or the prayers for blessing holy water or chrism. The “nuptial blessing” originally mentioned only the woman, although we know that the veil was often extended to cover the husband’s shoulders also. The blessing was located before the kiss of peace, which the priest gave to the husband, and the husband to his new bride. Remember that this is in the early centuries, long before the kiss of peace virtually disappeared from liturgy.


The veiling and blessing was required when priests or deacons married, was recommended to laypersons, but forbidden for certain public sinners and second marriages. The veiling of the couple was preserved in England until the Reformation, and is returning to practice among Swedish Lutherans after having fallen into disuse about seventy-five years ago.

Exactly the grace Pope Francis prays this Jubilee Year will renew in today's Church!

Reflexiones del Evangelio

EL DON DE PAZ

Se nos ofrece una visión distinta en la segunda lectura de hoy, una visión de la Nueva Jerusalén, "que descendía del cielo, resplandeciente con la gloria de Dios" (Apocalipsis 21:10). Si buscamos el significado detrás de la descripción de la radiante ciudad, vemos que la belleza mayor que se revela es la belleza de una perfecta armonía y orden, una ciudad fundada en la fe de las doce tribus de Israel y los doce Apóstoles, alumbrada únicamente por la gloria de Dios.



La primera lectura y el Evangelio también van conectados a esta descripción idealizada de la Nueva Jerusalén. En ambos leemos como la angustia y los altercados se contrarrestan con el don de la paz. "Mi paz les doy", les asegura Jesús a sus discípulos en la Última Cena (Juan 14:27). De acuerdo con ese don, los apóstoles y presbíteros, en la lectura de los Hechos, deciden no alterar la paz de los nuevos creyentes gentiles. No han de imponerles la excesiva carga de la circuncisión.


