NO COMPARISONS

How many times have we read or heard about someone who's gotten into trouble—maybe even fired from a job—because of a brush with the law? While our "Christian" minds tell us to be sorry and even pray for the person, a little voice inside our heads may also be saying, "I'm glad I would never do anything like that."



And perhaps we wouldn't. But are there some things we do that are still not pleasing in God's eyes? Today's readings caution us not to look so intently at someone else's wrongdoing that we overlook our own weaknesses and shortcomings. When we measure ourselves against the worst people we can think of, we come out looking pretty good. There is a danger, however, in using someone else's behavior as a way of reflecting our own goodness.



Dear Parishioners and friends,

“Be a Part of the Dream—Together We Build.” This is the theme of our new parish project — a new Multipurpose Parish Center.

Some of you have already attended one of the Campaign Receptions/Presentations held in the last few weeks. And, some of you have already indicated your participation and support, and have given your pledges. Thank you very much! We also thank those who attended our mini-presentation and/or picked up their packet last Sunday.

To those who were not able to pick up your packet, you may have already received it in the mail. I, together with the members of the Campaign Committee, ask you to **please read the contents of the packet so you may know and understand** why there is a need to build a new Multipurpose Parish Center.

Our existing parish hall was built more than 50 years ago to serve the needs of about less than 500 families. Today, I invite you to visit the parish hall, examine it, and ask yourself: *“Is this building big enough to serve more than 3,000 registered families plus the more than 1,000 non-registered families that we have now?”* You may also find out that many of the building parts - windows, doors, kitchen, bathrooms, the stage, electrical, etc. - are dilapidated, worn out, outdated, and certainly will be hazardous in a few years. *“Is it cost effective to have them fixed? Or, is it worth to build a new parish center - bigger, more functional, more bathrooms, and most especially meet the current safety requirements?”*

The church and all the buildings around it were built by the parishioners many years before us. As we acknowledge and thank our predecessors for their sacrifices, and for sharing their time, treasure, and talents, we need to accept the reality that the parish hall has become too small to serve the growing and vibrant community of St. Michael. **It is now our turn to make sacrifices and share our treasure**, so we can build a new and multipurpose parish center, not only **to serve our current needs**, but also ready **to serve the next generation**.

I would like to reiterate that every parish family become a part of this dream—our dream, yours and mine. We can make this dream a reality if we—members of the parish family—do our part in helping to raise the funds needed. I understand that not everyone can make the same size of gift, but I believe that everyone can make the same size of sacrifice. Please do not be afraid to call us and ask questions how you may participate.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Imagine the frustration of bishops who work strenuously over their *ad limina* reports, directing study committees, assembling data, honing the texts, traveling to Rome “to the threshold,” only to have it all collapse into a fifteen-minute group meeting with the pope. More than a few have grumbled at the weight of this “treasure” from our tradition, yet from the pope’s vantage point, they are essential to his ministry.

Pope John Paul II recalled his own experience as the Bishop of Kraków, visiting with Pope Paul VI in the late 1960s and early 1970s. The memory of those individual visits caused him to strengthen the format, assuring each of the world’s 2,744 bishops a privileged fifteen private minutes with the pope every five years. If you wonder what the pope does all day, the thought of dealing with five hundred bishops a year and reading their detailed reports on diocesan life should help fill up the calendar. Pope John Paul II used to say that he approached each individual meeting with the personal goal of learning something new about the Church, and his lively interest made the visits immensely worthwhile. The content of the private meetings remains under a privilege of secrecy, or as Cardinal Theodore McCarrick once said, “You’re only supposed to quote the pope if he tells a joke.”

There is an interesting twist we find in today's gospel when we hear Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector praying in the temple. The Pharisee is "praying to himself." It doesn't mean he was praying silently. It seems to mean something a lot more troubling, that he is praying to himself; that God is not his prayer's intended audience. The words of the Pharisee are very much centered on himself: he makes claims about his character. He highlights his own admirable activities. Good stewards of their prayer lives know that a prayer of praise and thanksgiving should focus on the goodness of God. Do our prayers of thanksgiving always stay focused on God's unfathomable, immeasurable goodness and generosity?

Jubilee Year of Mercy

October 23, 2016

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel graces us with a beautiful prayer that can make every day of our lives a jubilee of mercy: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" (Luke 18:13). Religious Israelites despised the tax collector who prayed it, for collaborating with Gentile occupiers and handling currency that bore the "divine" emperor's graven image. But the Pharisee's long-winded self-congratulation, mixed with self-righteous condemnation, was no "prayer" at all. "The Pharisee . . . spoke this prayer *to himself*" (18:11, emphasis added). Praying the tax collector's simple, sincere, succinct cry for mercy acknowledges our own sinfulness, and "welcomes" other sinners as brothers and sisters with whom we can identify, even empathize, echoing Pope Francis' famous comment about not being the one to judge. Indeed, the tax collector "went home justified" (18:14), that is, restored to God's friendship, for God's mercy is not prize achieved but gift received. "Let your prayer be brief: for tax collector, prodigal son, and dying thief were all reconciled to God by a single phrase!" (Saint John Climacus, 7th century).




