GOD'S HEALING JUSTICE

An old expression holds that the sun-warmed stone heals. Perhaps. But Malachi explains that only dark, sunless days are in store for those who do not find a place for God in their lives. Conversely, he tells us that the warmth and light of God's healing justice await those who fear the Lord. That's a pretty comforting notion—especially now in the already short and growing even shorter days of November. It's the sun-warmed stone, and then some.

Paul speaks to us of justice as well, but points out that it is not a passive thing. To be treated justly, we need to do our fair share. If we are diligent and persevere we will be rewarded with and by the fruits of our labor. Lastly, Luke, too, tells us to persevere—in faith, this time—and our lives will be secure in God regardless of how we are treated by our enemies.



Dear Parishioners and friends,

During the last two weekends, we held an active campaign for our *“Be a Part of the Dream—Together We Build”* Project. I am happy that 237 parishioners and friends have pledged to participate and currently we received almost \$900,000 in pledges, and we received around \$70,000 in down payments. Thank you!

Looking back and grateful for the sacrifices that the less than 300 families offered to build our place of worship—this St. Michael Church—and the buildings around it 59 years ago, I am confident that the over than 3,000 families that we have now will also make the same sacrifice to build a building—a new multi-purpose parish center that will meet the needs of our growing community, and especially for the future generations.



I understand that some are scared looking at the amount shown on the “Suggested Pledge Chart”. I would like to reiterate that **we do not expect the same amount, but the same sacrifice**. Will any of the following amount be a sacrificial gift from your family:

- \$5,000 which is **\$125 monthly for 40 months**; or
- \$4,000 which is **\$100 monthly for 40 months**; or
- \$3,000 which is **\$75 monthly for 40 months**; or
- \$2,000 which is **\$50 monthly for 40 months**; or
- \$1,000 which is **\$25 monthly for 40 months**?

Our goal is to raise at least \$3,000,000 in order for us to start the process of building our new parish center. **We don't need the actual money until beginning of January 2017, but we need your pledges and commitment now.** The Diocese will get involved only after they see our pledges and commitment.

If you have not yet participated, will you consider making a pledge today? You may find pledge cards in the pews or in the vestibule. Please, drop your pledge card in the offertory basket during Mass, or you may bring it to the parish office. You may also participate online at www.stmichaelsandiego.org; register for online giving and click on the Capital Campaign.

Once again, I invite every parish family—those who are registered, and those who consider St. Michael their home parish— become a part of this dream. Together, we can make this dream a reality, not only for our present generation, but especially for our children and our children's children.

My sincere gratitude to all those who have already participated. May God continue to shower you with blessings and graces.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

With Thanksgiving approaching, we think of the quest of the Puritans who arrived on the *Mayflower* from their first exile in Leyden, Holland. Like the Catholics of England, they were religious dissenters who suffered penalties for not participating in the worship life of the established church. The Catholics established monasteries, schools, and convents on the continent to assure the vigor of their faith's intellectual and spiritual life. The Puritans fled to the tolerant Netherlands with similar hopes of preserving their way of life, but were unable to adapt to Dutch ways.

There were Catholics who made a similar colonial journey. The hero of the story is George Calvert, Lord Baltimore, the former Secretary of State of Britain and a Catholic. He proposed that King Charles I establish a proprietary colony that he would own and rule, named Maryland in honor of the Catholic Queen Henrietta Maria. George Calvert died unexpectedly in the midst of this project, but his son Cecil faithfully carried out his father's wishes. Maryland became a symbol of freedom for wealthy recusant English families, as well as for the poor who held to the Catholic faith despite great hardship. From the start, the colony was open to Protestants and Catholics equally, and the seeds of the religious freedom so dear to the American spirit were sown with the first colonists in 1634.

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

As this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* comes to an end, Jesus' first disciples ask what every age seems to wonder about the end of the world: "Teacher, when will this happen? What sign will there be?" (Luke 21:7). But instead of what we'd like to know, Jesus tells us what we need to know. Don't be terrified by natural disasters, human violence, personal sufferings. Because God's mercy abounds, all is grace. "It will lead to your giving testimony" (21:13). So Malachi promises "the sun of justice with its healing rays" (Malachi 3:20a); and Jesus describes how we should welcome the end: "Stand erect and raise your heads, because your redemption is at hand" (Gospel Acclamation, Luke 21:28). Rather than worrying about ourselves and the future's perils, both Jesus' gospel and Pope Francis' *Jubilee Year of Mercy* bid us go forth to spend our lives proclaiming God's promise of boundless mercy, but also translating God's mercy into living deeds of unfailing compassion and enduring comfort.

Si somos diligentes y perseveramos, seremos recompensados con y por los frutos de nuestra labor. Finalmente, Lucas también nos llama a perseverar –en la fe, esta vez– y nos dice que nuestras vidas estarán aseguradas en Dios no importa cómo nos traten nuestros enemigos.


